

We look forward to seeing you in-person soon!








Jazzmen's internship was so successful, she was named the 2021 Urban Alliance Washington, DC Intern of the Year!

CAREER READY INTERNSHIPS



Internships remained virtual for the summer of 2021. Destination DC and the American Experience Foundation employed 34 interns from Career Academies at seven DC high schools. Interns were asked to imagine what the hospitality industry could and should look like after COVID-19 while also ensuring it is an industry that is equitable for all.

The Career Ready Internship program allowed students to delve into the world of hospitality through group research and daily guest speakers. Returning interns served as Group Leaders, receiving additional support and leadership training. Each week, interns gave three-minute presentations to professionals from across the industry, receiving immediate feedback on their strengths and areas of improvement.




